The Montgomery Bus Boycott was a civil rights protest during which African Americans refused to ride city buses in Montgomery, Alabama. Essay entries must be compelling and discuss the key events and circumstances surrounding the boycott, the primary goals and motivations that drove the participants, and how the boycott's outcome impacted the future.

- 2. Entries must be a word document using 12-point or Arial or Times New Roman font, double spaced.
- 3. All fields on the entry form must be completed.
- 4. Each entry must contain 750-1,000 words.
- 5. All entries must include the following:
 - a. Student's name at the top of the first page
 - b. Proof of current grade/ a copy of student's ID or progress report.
- 6. Essays must be the original work of the student. Plagiarism will not be tolerated, to include essays from Artificial Intelligence essay submissions.
- 7. An automatic reply will state if the maximum number of essays has been reached.
- 8. Cash prizes: First Place: \$500.00 Second Place: \$300.00 Third Place: \$200.00
- 9. Prize checks will be sent via first class mail. Essay contest winners will be notified via email or telephonically.
- 10. The attached rubric will be used to score the essay.
