- 1. Entries must be received no later than February 28, 2025/11:59 P.M.
- 2. Entries must be a word document using 12-point or Arial or Times New Roman font, double spaced.
- 3. Each entry must contain 750-1,000 words.
- 4. Complete entries consist of the following:
  - a. Essay-Student's name should be in the top right corner of the first page
  - b. **Identification** Proof of current grade/ a copy of student's ID or progress report.
  - c. Student Entry Form signed by student and parent
- 5. Essays must be the original work of the student. Plagiarism will not be tolerated, to include essays from Artificial Intelligence essay submissions.
- 6. An automatic reply will state if the maximum number of essays (75) has been reached.
- 7. Cash prizes: First Place: \$500.00 Second Place: \$300.00 Third Place: \$200.00
- 8. Prize checks will be sent via first class mail. Essay contest winners will be notified via email, text message or telephonically.

- 9. Essays will be scored on the criteria listed below:
  - a. **Content-**Thoroughly addresses the prompt with clear and relevant information. Presents well-researched, accurate facts and examples. Demonstrates deep understanding of the topic
  - b. **Organization** Essay is very well-organized; has a clear introduction, body, and conclusion. Ideas flow logically, with effective use of transitions
  - c. **Style-** Engaging and appropriate tone for the audience. Varied sentence structure and vocabulary. Demonstrates creativity in presentation
  - d. Mechanics Virtually no grammatical, punctuation, or spelling errors. Proper formatting and citations.
